Due Diligence and Risk Assessment

The procedures and policies in place at Metcalf's can ensure modern slavery does not exist within our direct employment we recognise the need to be vigilant in who we appoint as sub-contractors and where we procure materials / services from.

Our policies and procedures

We have implemented procedures and policies to help us manage the potential modern slavery and human trafficking issues, which include but are not limited to pre-employment checks, ensuring employees receive fair remuneration and equality in the workplace.

We will only work with sub-contractors who are CIS registered to reduce the risk of modern slavery and we commit to procure our materials/services through a supply chain who take their responsibility to prevent modern slavery seriously.

- Maintain our existing policies and improve on them where possible
- To highlight the importance of this issue with all employees via communications
- Provide training to employees in how to identify potential issues
